

JANE FAWCETT-HOOVER

Jane Fawcett Hoover is currently President of JFH Strategies, LLC, an independent consulting company. Prior to retiring from The Procter & Gamble Company in 2005 with thirty years of service, Ms. Hoover served as their Vice President for National Government Relations. In this capacity, she managed all Washington and international global government relations efforts. Procter & Gamble is headquartered in Cincinnati, Ohio and is an \$79 billion dollar business.

Named one of the ten “Voices of Influence” by members of the Ohio Congressional delegation, Ms. Hoover has excelled in other lobbying activities. In 2006 she was presented with the prestigious Bryce Harlow-Business Government Award given for significant contributions to the advocacy profession through a lifelong career as an exemplary role model. Ms. Hoover is the first woman chosen to have received this honor.

Ms. Hoover serves on the Boards of the First Ladies Library and the Bryce Harlow Institute. She is a member and former President of the Business-Government Relations Council, which is an organization of the top ranking Washington Representatives of Fortune 500 companies. She is also active in the Immanuel Presbyterian Church, McLean, Va.

Born in Defiance, Ohio, Ms. Hoover grew up a devoted “Buckeye.” She is a graduate of The Ohio State University with a B.S. in Human Ecology and Masters work in Journalism and Communications.

Ms. Hoover has been active in The Ohio State University Alumni Association. She was elected to the Ohio State University Alumni Board of Directors where she served as Vice Chairman from 1992-94. In 1996 she was selected to serve on the OSU Alumni Advisory Council and was Chairman from 1999-2000. In 2004 Ms. Hoover was honored with the Ralph Davenport Mershon Award for exceptional leadership and service to Ohio State.

In 2006, Ms. Hoover was elected to serve on the OSU Development Fund Board. Additionally, in recognition of her outstanding service and advocacy on behalf of The Ohio State University, Ms. Hoover was presented the Distinguished Service Award at OSU’s winter 2003 commencement.
